If you have: TWO WEEKS

A Digital Detox package at Grand Velas Riviera Maya in Mexico starts with the Detox Concierge 'cleansing' your suite (removing the TV and bringing in board games) and storing your electronic devices in the safe. In return, you get four bracelets, each one entitling you to a free (and tech-free) activity – a bike ride followed by an eco tour, then a combination snorkel and kayak adventure, and finally a relaxing spa treatment. You have to complete the first activity to do the second and so on, but they can be done on consecutive days or spread over two weeks with lazy tech-free days in-between. Soulshine Retreats is based in a luxury villa high in Soulshine Retreats is based in a luxury villa high in the hills of northern lbiza, with glistening sea views and a secluded private beach. It lays on a daily programme of yoga, meditation and other holistic therapies to gently wean the digitally addicted off their devices. On arrival, guests take a photo of the team's contact details, send it to anyone they think should have it, then turn off their phones for the program of the program o think should have it, then turn off their phones for the week. Not sure you're up to going cold turkey on the digital front? Test the water with a stay at The Scarlet, an eco-luxe spa hotel on the north Cornish coast. Wi-Fi is available if you must, but there's no phone signal, so many guests take that as their cue to stay disconnected while they're there. It helps that the hotel was specifically designed as a relaxing, adults-only escape, with diversions including cliff-top hot tubs, a natural reed-bed swimming pool and an Ayurvedic-inspired spa. Tucked away on the shores of Lough Erne, 100 miles west of Belfast, is Finn Lough Resort, home to two Forest Domes. Giant bubbles in a woodland clearing, they're filled with life's little luxuries (four-poster bed, waterfall shower, vintage record player, under-floor heating) but no Wi-Fi or TV. As well as star-gazing, go walking and cycling, enjoy water sports and make full use of the spa. Ryanair and Easyjet fly to Belfast International, from around £45 return, and you can pick up a hire car at the airport.
